It's always nice to credit the various artists chosen for the TailWagger's cover art, yet it's often very difficult. For this 1907 February cover of **A Woman's Home Companion**, I was utterly unsuccessful at finding any information about the illustration or the artist who created it. However, Elizabeth Stuart Phelps, whose name you see written on the cover, is worth a mention.

Phelps was born in 1844 and led a fascinating life as a dog fancier, feminist, and American author who wrote 57 volumes of fiction and numerous essays, articles, and poetry. She challenged traditional Christian beliefs of the afterlife {insisting that, "Oh yes, you are reunited with your family pets"—my paraphrase), challenged women's traditional roles in marriage and family, and advocated clothing reform for women, even going so far as to encourage women to burn their corsets. So now that we've established that she was 'pure dead brilliant', we can understand how she became the first woman to present a lecture series at Boston University and marry a man 17 years her junior. Near the end of her life, she was also very active in the animal rights movement. Her novel, Trixy, published in 1904, became a standard polemic against the experimentation of animals. She was an extraordinary individual.

A Wee Bit of Collie History

Florence Bell Ilch, Award-winning Collie Breeder



Florence B. Ilch put Red Bank, New Jersey, in Monmouth County on the map of the dog world with her outstanding Collies. For more than forty years on the Navesink River shore, Bellhaven Kennels produced and imported some of the country's best dogs and still holds the record for the first Collie to win the Working Group and the only Collie to win Best in Show (BIS) at the Westminster Dog Show way back in 1929. That dog, "Ch. Laund Loyalty of Bellhaven," shown here, remains the youngest of any breed to win Best In Show.

Here is the description of her Collie journey in her own words, published in the Collie Club of America:

"I was born in New York City, the only daughter of the late James Bell and Lida Pearce Bell. My father was born in Ireland, as were his ancestors for generations back. He was educated at Dublin College and became a silk and velvet importer until joining the firm of R.H. Macy, with which he was connected for twenty-five years until his retirement. Shortly after I was born, we moved to Brooklyn, which became our winter home until my father's death in 1913, at which time we made Bellhaven, then our summer home, our permanent all year residence. I was educated at the Convent of the Visitation.. Though no one in my family were Roman Catholics, I had always had a great fondness for the sweet, black-robed nuns, and the Convent was my own choice. A few months after graduation at the age of 16, I married Alfred Ilch of New York City. Two sons, Alfred and James were born in Brooklyn. One daughter, Virginia was born at Bellhaven. After Virginia finished her education, she decided to join up

with the business end of Bellhaven and has been a most wonderful help to me. In fact, were it not for her we would not have been able to make half the shows we have, as aside from the care of the dogs while away, which of course is the kennelmans job, there is a great deal of responsibility at Bellhaven that must be properly handled. I grew up with horses and dogs, and always thoroughbreds. On my ninth birthday, my father presented me with a huge Saint Bernard pup. I had read about the coming Westminster show and showed my pup in a class of eighteen. He won H.C., and I can truthfully say I have never since been so proud of an award. However, I admired the beautiful winner, Kingtonian Golf, shown by Frank Gould, who explained where my dog was wrong. I realized then I had no show dog and never showed "Marquis" again. Until my boys were nine and ten years old, I had no time for anything but them and their baby sister, but after that, they wanted a dog. It was one of the oldest Collie fanciers in the country, John Gamewell, then of Little Silver, NJ, now of New York City, a close friend of the late Albert Payson Terhune, who was instrumental in starting me in Collies. He suggested I buy a Collie from the late Pat Tully, and the only requirement I stated when writing for a pup was that he must be a tri, my favorite then and always. The dog came - a grand big fellow, and the children made a great pet of him. Shortly after, Westminster came around again, and the old showbug came to life (It seems I never picked small shows). Major was placed third in a class of three, and I realized then that you cannot expect a \$150 pet to win at Westminster. I then bought three of Mrs. Lunt's (Alstead) best bitches, paying top price; two of them, Alstead

Attractive and Alstead Allysum, won their championships. I found I needed a stud dog (the bug was then taking hold), and I bought Starbat Strongheart for a thousand dollars, at 9 months, after he had been beaten at Westminster. The old timers lifted eyebrows and said I would learn only by experience. Nobody considered him worth half the price; otherwise, they would have snapped him up long before I had a chance to buy him, as I only did so as the show was closing the last night. One person did not think I was crazy - and that was Mike Kennedy, then a perfect stranger to me, and Stronghearts handler at that show. Strongheart came back the next year to the Garden to take Winners, and the two consecutive years to Best of Breed, and was unofficially selected (there was NO official Best of Show that year) as Best in the Show. He won all over the country, defeating every good Collie out at the time; won three championships, 45 points, all big shows, and sired 23 champions, three of his sons

winning over 45 points each. This justified the price I paid and proved that my eye was not as far off, after all. I then wanted new blood, and it was my mother who financed most of my earlier importations. Had it not been for her, I could never have brought over all of the great dogs that I did. I mentioned above that my eye for the Collie was not so far off as the purchase of Strongheart proved; to add to this, I think I had an eye for a good handler also, as others had a chance to hire Mike Kennedy at the time but failed to do so. It is not necessary for me to dwell on Mike or what he means to Bellhaven. Everyone knows him and acknowledges he has no peer. He has just celebrated his 25th year as Manager of Bellhaven. We have bred 84 champions and completed 126 championships in the last 27 years."

Bellhaven ceased operation in 1966, with Kennedy's retirement. He passed in 1979, and Ilch followed in 1982 at 90. Today, the property is a town park named after the estate.
